Prof. Boldizzoni latest work, *Foretelling the End of Capitalism* (2020), examines misadventures in social forecasting since Karl Marx and offers an explanation for the persistence of capitalism, while casting doubt on its future prospects. He has also published *The Poverty of Clio: Resurrecting Economic History* (2011), a critique of the domination of quantitative «cliometrics» in the field of economic history.



Prof. O'Sullivan has explored the history of corporate governance, business firms and financial markets. After publishing *Dividends of Development: Securities Markets in the History of U.S. Capitalism* (2016), her current research deals with the role of profits in the early industrial era.
